The Interagency One-Stop Policy and Technical Assistance Workgroup, is presenting a series of informal briefings describing the individual WIOA Partner programs that make up the workforce system. Hosted by ETA, these monthly briefings provide a forum to understand each of our programs better, learn how we fit together as a workforce system, ultimately resulting in creating the integrated service delivery system envisioned by WIOA.

Have you wondered how the National Farmworker Jobs Program (NFJP); Migrant and Seasonal Farmworkers (MSFW); Monitor Advocate, and Senior Community Service Employment Program (SCSEP) support the workforce system under WIOA?

The NFJP was created under the 1964 Civil Rights Act and is currently authorized under Section 167 of WIOA. The NFJP partners with community organizations and state agencies to counter the chronic unemployment and underemployment experienced by farmworkers who depend primarily on jobs in agricultural labor performed across the country. The Monitor Advocate System helps ensure farmworkers receive career and training services (i.e. career guidance, assessment, job development, training, and job referral) and workforce protections on an equal and non-discriminatory basis

SCSEP, authorized by the Older Americans Act in 1965, fosters economic self-sufficiency for older, low-income adults with poor employment prospects by providing job skills training through community service employment assignments, and other job-training opportunities.
